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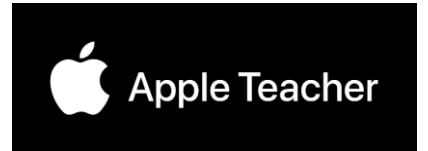

What is online safety?

Online Safety is being aware of the nature of the possible threats that you could encounter whilst engaging in activity through the Internet, these could be security threats, protecting and managing your personal data, online reputation management, and avoiding harmful or illegal content.

Conduct

- Children need to be aware of the impact that their online activity can have. Not just on themselves but also on others around them.
- The internet is a vast place and unfortunately on some occasions there are people online that aren't always who they say they are.
- Sharing information online can be done without even thinking twice. It's important that personal information stays restricted.

Content

- Not all content online is safe for children to watch/view. This can also be true for the content accessed through online games, streams and websites.
- Live comments and chats are another easy way for harmful information/content to be passed around.
- Building a safe environment for children to learn is great if you can achieve it. By speaking with you children and having open conversations can improve the reliability of them understanding that online, not everything is as it seems.



Contact

- It is more important than ever that all children understand who they are communicating with online.
- Friends should only be added to an account by an adult and only once the adult has verified it is the correct person.
- If you have any concerns about who your children are talking to online or the nature of a conversation. It is vital that you report it directly to the police via the CEOP service.

Cyber Bullying and Inappropriate Messaging

- This can take place in many different ways including unkind message or comments, sharing embarrassing photos or exclusion from group chats.
- Children need to understand that the actions they do online can be just as harmful as actions they do in person.
- Any message that comes through containing inappropriate content to anyone under the age of 18, needs to be reported directly to the police immediately.



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Our Advice



Online Contact or Inappropriate Messaging

- Discuss online friendships with your child. Ensure they understand that a person they have never seen face to face is still a stranger.
- Ensure they understand that no personal information should ever be shared with someone they have never met.
- Build a trust zone with them. Ensure they feel safe to come and discuss things with you regarding conversations or things they see online.
- If you have concerns about who your children are talking to online or the nature of a conversation. It is vital that you report it directly to the police via the CEOP service.

Online Bullying

- Discuss online bullying with your child/ren. Teach them the importance of open discussion and make sure they know the correct steps to block or remove people from their accounts.

Top Tips

- Ensure you save the evidence
- Ensure you report it to the school/the police
- Block the user from all forms of future contact



My Top Tips

- Consider setting up a family shared email address
- Encourage your child/ren to always think before they post
- Discuss content that you share on your social media as well
- Ensure your child/ren knows what to do if they see something they don't want to see
- Lead by example



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
